LISTOPADA



Kasia Banasiewicz, uczennica klasy 7 zdobyła I miejsce w międzyszkolnym konkursie plastycznym „Świat bez barier” zorganizowanym przez Świetlicę Wspierająco-Integrującą „PLUS” w Kielcach.



7 listopada odbyła się uroczystość z okazji Narodowego Święta Niepodległości. Uczniowie klas 5-8 wraz z przedszkolakami wzięli udział w ogólnopolskiej akcji „Szkoła do hymnu”. Podczas uroczystości przypomniano także najważniejsze wydarzenia z historii Polski. Na koniec odbyło się rozstrzygnięcie szkolnego konkursu historycznego na prezentację multimedialną pt. „Drogi Polaków do Niepodległości”. Weather in Poland during winter

Weather during winter in Poland is very cold and snowy.

Temperatures are often around zero degree, but in the east and in the south, they can be below zero!

What do kids love to do during winter?

❄️ Play "Stacking Snowmen" - a classic winter game.

🛼 Skate on an ice rink or on a frozen pond (if it is safe).

🎿 Ski - even small children can try it!

❄️ Prepare snowballs for snowball fights and make angels in the snow.

🏠 Drink hot chocolate when you get home.

🎄 Decorate the house for Christmas and help bake gingerbread cookies.

📺 Watch cartoons and play board games when it's very cold outside.

🎨 Make winter art works - drawings, laurels and decorations.

Winter in Spain

Winters in Spain are very varied: in the south and on the islands, there are mild and often sunny temperatures reaching up to 18-22°C, while in the north of the country the weather can be cooler and rainy.

In the centre, especially in Madrid, the mornings can be freezing, although snow rarely appears. The most winter weather prevails in the Pyrenees and the surrounding mountains, where there is regular snowfall and many ski resorts operate.

Facts about winter

- Every winter, one septillion (it is 1 followed by 24 zeros !) snowflakes fall from the sky.
- The largest snowman in the world was made in February 1999 in Bethel. It was 113 feet and 7 inches tall!
- Sunsets and sunrises are nicer in winter. This is because dry winter air is cleaner than summer air. This makes the colours of the sun more impressive then!

How does snow form?

Snow forms high in the clouds when water vapour rises from the Earth's surface, then freezes at a very low temperature and finally forms tiny ice crystals. These crystals fuse into snowflakes that fall to the ground if the air below the clouds is also cold enough not to melt.

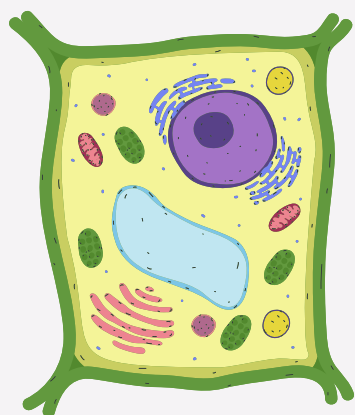

- receive a special distinction (a laureate/a finalist).

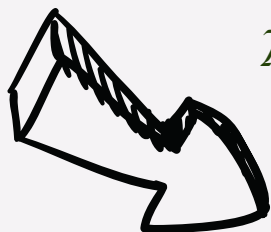

"I will be punctual for classes every day"

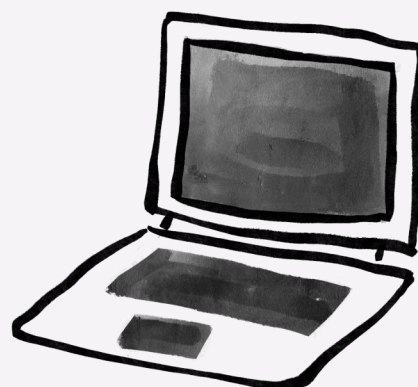
"I will try to believe in myself more than before."

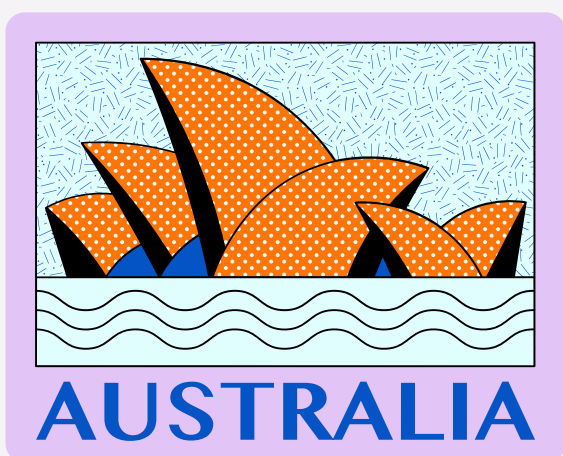


Fun facts about Sydney
